As the man picked up the handle of his suitcase and prepared to leave. I asked his name and if I could pray for his trip, his safety—which I did, and ended with sharing the truest hope man has ever been offered—hope and safety in the love of Christ's sacrifice on the cross for our sins, mine, and the sins of my new friend.

The current covid crisis reminds me of the aftermath of the 9/11 attacks of 2001. That event, that crisis, changed how we now do many of our everyday things. I was in New York City shortly after the 9/11 attacks, praying with first responders and people on the street, survivors of the attacks. In the streets, I noticed silence in the city, few people going out. I noticed that those I did encounter on the streets made purposeful effort to make eye contact, looking for a smile—perhaps looking for hope. Today, like 9/11, our sense of safety, certainty, of hope, has been called into question.



- Breakfast cereal-children and adult, Boxed muffins mixes, boxed corn bread mixes, pancake mix, pudding mixes, Jello
